CELEBRATING CHAUVIN'S HISTORY!

The First Dr. Folkins School



Officially opened November 18, 1949



"June 1st, 1978 - a day not to be forgotten, one that left a saddened community, and a school in smoldering rubble."

Quoted from 1982 Chauvin history book 'Across The Years'

The original 1910 Chauvin School underwent various expansions and improvements over the decades. In the late 1940's as enrollment increased and neighbouring schools closed, new construction began and the renamed Dr. Folkins School opened.

Tragically, in 1978 a fire broke out at the school. The alarm was immediately raised, but despite the combined efforts of fire brigades from Chauvin, Edgerton, Wainwright, and Provost, the blaze continued to spread uncontrollably. Twelve oil tankers transported water after the local supply in the village was depleted. As a final desperate measure to salvage what remained, the burning walls were bulldozed, leaving only the gym and Home Ec room standing.

Temporary classrooms were found for students the following year while the 'Save Our School' committee and local trustee convinced the Board to keep the K-12 school intact. In September 1980, students returned to a new, modern and bright Dr. Folkins Community School, today a treasured fixture of our village.

She said, "Perhaps he just wanted to encourage you."

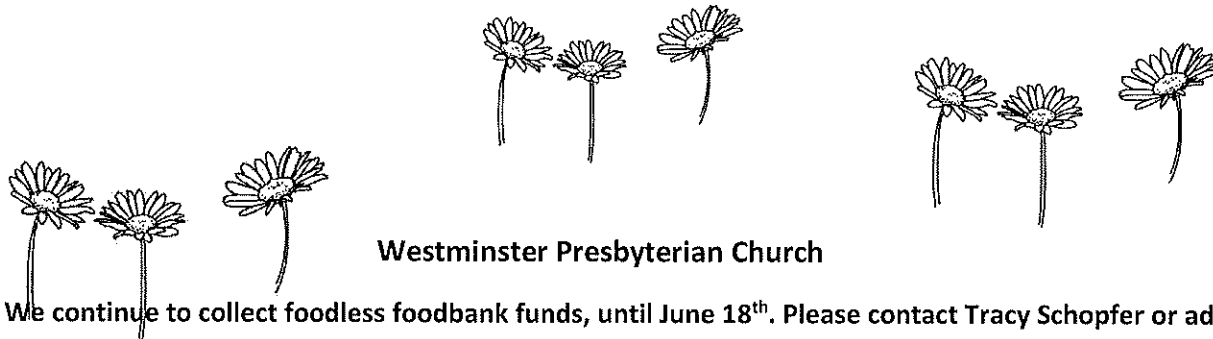

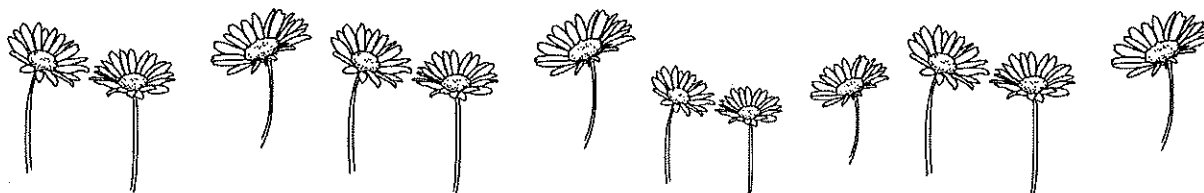

Devotional from the Bible App, April 28th, 2023

The Presence of God

Throughout Scripture we learn about the presence of God. It is in the presence of God that we find strength and hope (Psalm 27:1). It's also in God's presence that our enemies lose their power over us (Psalm 27:2-3).

Of David

- 1 *The Lord is my light and my salvation – Whom shall I fear?
The Lord is the stronghold of my life – Of whom shall I be afraid?*
- 2 *When the wicked advance against me to devour me,
It is my enemies and my foes who will stumble and fall*
- 3 *Though an army besiege me, my heart will not fear;
Though war break out against me, even then I will be confident.*

In (Psalm 27:4) the writer of the Psalm expresses his desire to dwell within the house of the LORD, to gaze upon God's beauty and be in His presence in the temple. In the Old Testament, the presence of God was primarily within the temple. But through spending time with God, the Psalmist found hope and restoration for his soul.

- 4 *One thing I ask from the LORD, this only do I seek:
That I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life,
To gaze on the beauty of the LORD and to seek Him in His temple.*

Thanks to Jesus, God's presence is no longer confined to the temple. His presence is now available to us through the Holy Spirit who dwells within believers. **We now have access to God's presence at any time.** Just like the writer of the Psalm desired to dwell within God's presence, we also should desire to be with God as much as possible.

It is in God's presence that we find hope, joy, beauty, and the restoration of our weary souls.

It is important that we spend time with God each and every day. We can do this through regularly reading Scripture and reflecting on what we read. We can also spend time in prayer, talking to God about what is happening in our life. Another way to spend time in God's presence is to simply be aware that He is with you through your daily tasks each day.
