





for **2026-27 at Dr. Folkins Community School** is now open.

Please note that an original birth certificate for your child is needed to complete the registration. If you do not have a birth certificate, please apply for one promptly. The birth certificate will be scanned and returned to you as soon as possible.

What is the Greatest Commandment?

from: Turning Point with Dr David Jeremiah

In Mark 12 Jesus was fielding a series of hostile questions from critics who were trying to trip Him up. They asked Him about everything, including His own Resurrection. Although the questions were inflammatory, He answered with so much wisdom, they couldn't find fault with His answers.

Then a scribe, a religious man who would have been very familiar with all 600+ commandments in Jewish law - asked Jesus this: Which is the first commandment of all?

Jesus answered by going to Deuteronomy 6:4-5. He said, "The first of all the commandments is: 'Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is one! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.' This is the first commandment."

The command to love God is our greatest obligation and joy. By gazing at the immense masterpiece of Gods' love - the Crucifixion - we can learn something about our two greatest duties in life - loving God and loving one another. There, we can learn something about the purposeful, selfless, unconditional, and sacrificial nature of Gods love. One way our love for God should be recognized is through obedience. Jesus says to 'love me and keep my commands ...' (John 14:15, 21). Another way is through prayer (Psalm 16:1) and also by hating evil (Psalm 97:10). We also show our love when we long for His return (Revelation 22:20).

In Mark 12:31 Jesus says, " And the second, like it, is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself. '

There is no other commandment greater than these."

Jesus told us to love God; then He went on to tell us to love our neighbor in the same way we'd like to be loved ourselves. This particular passage is repeated in other Gospels, and we call it the Golden Rule. What this rule can do is help us understand how to implement His second commandment. If we want to understand what it means to love God, we have to love others; and if we really want to love others, we have to treat them with kindness, fairness, gentleness, honesty, integrity, and servanthood - just as we ourselves want to be treated.

The second commandment tells us to love others with action-based care. If they lost their job we'd grieve as if we lost ours. If one of their loved ones' dies, we'll feel the pain. Whenever they have a need we'll try to fill it.

In order to be all the way into the Kingdom of God we must follow the greatest command, which is the simplest thing in the world - to love the Lord your God with all your being and to love your neighbor as yourself.

And all of this sounded so wonderful when I first wrote it – until I remembered something very important.

I remembered the place from where faith like this ever truly begins:

From the weeping that comes before the singing, more than from the singing.

From the darkness that comes before the dawn, more than from the dawn.

From the defeat that comes before the victory, more than from the victory.

Scented less like roses and perfume.

More like the smoke that lingers from burned-out hopes and expectations.

More like the dust from the rubble of broken hearts and shattered egos.

This is why faith is never easy.

Nevertheless, this is where faith always begins, and here's why:

The faith the Church proclaims, and the Church that faith sustains, began exactly that way:

Not on a throne, but in a tomb.

Not with a tea-party, but with a trial.

Not with blessing, but with a betrayal.

Not with a great King, standing to receive homage, but with a condemned man, stooping, with towel and basin, in humble servitude.

Who warned His disciples: Faith would one day require them to do likewise.

But who promised them: Faith would do things through them, and to them, and even in spite of them.

But also because of them.

Faith would invite them on a journey they thought they would never need to take.

Faith would lead them to places they thought they would never need to go.

So they went. Not always willingly, but they went anyway. Obeying Jesus.

Eventually, they came to own something wonderful.

Eventually, something wonderful came to own them.

A Faith That Lives - A Living Faith.

Faith that grows and gives life to others in the real world.

And treats real issues. And cares for real people.

And helps real people to love other real people.


And believes in and loves God. And not just with words.

YAC still supports applications to Foundational Learning Assistance program for those who fall under the below eligibility:

- Between the ages of 16-19
- Meet one of the GoA eligibility criteria
- The student must be registered "Full Time" at an approved educational facility. "Full Time" is defined as being registered and participating in a minimum of 3 classes per semester to be considered for FLA Funding.
- Meeting expected attendance and progress as per FLA policy.
- Social Insurance Number
- All eligible students must create an account on Alberta.ca <https://account.alberta.ca>
- Bank account

Alberta Works funded learners are expected to attend the program, make acceptable progress, achieve their training goal and facilitate a successful transition to further education or employment. Funding is based on participation/progression in the classes and consultations with the student as well as the school.

What's New

Service Coordinator Update:

For those funded learners, Service Coordinators will be contacting schools and students for mandatory progress and attendance documents for semester one completions. Service Coordinators will also require an attendance report for semester two, to verify attendance to meet ongoing funding eligibility.

Tax season is around the corner!

Funded students are aware this funding counts as income, and they'll need to report it when doing their taxes. Student will be issued a tax slip in February to their address on file.
